Since 1923, Florida Blue Key has served as the producer and host of the University of Florida's annual Homecoming celebration. Homecoming brings together students and alumni to celebrate the University of Florida. The culmination of Homecoming is Gator Growl, widely recognized as the the 'World's Largest Student Run Pep Rally', the show is held annually in Ben Hill Griffin Stadium at the University of Florida.

Beyond its popularity and tradition, Gator Growl is renowned for being a launching pad for many beloved entertainers such as Robin Williams, Dennis Miller, Jerry Seinfeld, Dave Chappelle, Bill Cosby, Billy Crystal, Bob Hope, Daniel Tosh and Dane Cook.

There are generally around 1500 participants for the event and this year is sure to be no different.
